- 3rd largest economy in Southeast Asia and the 30th largest economy in the world by purchasing power parity

- Traditional crafts- Malaysia boasts a wide range of crafts, from batik and Songket (brocade) to rattan baskets
 and labu, gourd-shaped ceramic jugs.
- Shopping in Kuala-lampur -Malaysia's capital boasts a host of excellent malls, as well as vibrant street markets where bargaining is de rigueur(rigor)
- Georgetown- A bustling Chinese-dominated haven with elaborate temples, colonial-era mansions and beaches galore.
- Melaka- The city's complex historical heritage is evident in its Portuguese, Dutch and British buildings and Peranakan ancestral homes.
- Langkawi- Luxurious resorts on sublime beaches pretty much sums up these west-coast islands, close to the border with Thailand.
- The Petronas Towers- KL's iconic towers not only hold your gaze from all angles but also house one of the city's best shopping malls.



The Perhentian Islands – These are the popular pair of islands off the east coast, with beautiful beaches & great snorkelling

- Taman Negara- One of the world's oldest rainforests, with hides for wildlife-spotting, treetop walkways and treks lasting from an hour to a whole week.
- Sungai Kinabatangan- Cruise through pristine jungle along this spectacular river, spotting proboscis monkeys and occasionally, orang-utans.
- Rainforest music festival- Held annually near Kuching, this world-music festival is an opportunity to see indigenous performers alongside musicians from across the globe.
- Cameron Highlands- The Misty tea plantations, afternoon tea and jungle trails in cool mountain air.
- Kelabit Highlands- These remote uplands offer excellent walks and hikes, plus encounters with friendly tribal communities along the way.
- Mt. Kinabalu- Watch dawn over Borneo from the summit of southeast asia's highest mountain.
- Gunung Mulu National Park- A view of razor-sharp limestone pinnacles reward the challenging haul up Gunung Api, and the park also boasts underground caves that teem with wildlife.
- Diving at Pulav Sipadan- The spectacular islands off Sabah offer the thrill of swimming with sharks and turtles

SUGGESTED ITINERARY

Day 1: Arrival at Kuala Lumpur International Airport

- Arrival at the Airport & Transfer to Genting via Coaches
- En-route breakfast at a coffee shop & continue with **Batu cave** visit along with one way cable car ride (13km north of Kuala Lumpur-Genting Skyway, Southeast Asia's fastest and longest cable car)

- Transfers to Kuala lumpur International Airport for onward flight home


