Table Mountain is a flat-topped mountain forming a prominent landmark overlooking the city of Cape Town in South Africa. It is a significant tourist attraction, with many visitors using the cableway or hiking to the top. The mountain forms part of the Table Mountain National Park. Table Mountain is home to a large array of fauna and flora, most of which is endemic.

Table Mountain National Park is a national park in Cape Town, South Africa, proclaimed on 29 May 1998, for the purpose of protecting the natural environment of the Table Mountain Chain, and in particular the rare fynbos vegetation. The park is managed by South African National Parks. The property is included as part of the UNESCO Cape Floral Region World Heritage Site.

The Cape of Good Hope is a promontory off of the southern tip of South Africa. Robben Island is for centuries it was used as a penal colony, primarily for political prisoners. The island famous

as the place where former South African president Nelson Mandela was an inmate for 18 years. Robben Island is located several kilometres offshore. The journey giving you plenty of time to admire spectacular views of Cape Town and to look for the whales, dolphins, penguins and fur seals that inhabit Table Bay.



Located in False Bay just off the coast of Cape Town, Seal Island is a small granite landform absolutely swarmed with Cape Fur Seals. The piles of seals use the island as their main breeding ground and usually are left in peace. The Great White Sharks also love the little island and at certain times of the year create a circle around it known as the Ring of Death.

Chapman's Peak is one of the most spectacular marine drives in the world. Chapman's Peak Drive is affectionately known as "Chappies" and is a must for anyone who is passionate about the majestic scenery of Cape Town. The route starts at the picturesque fishing harbour of Hout Bay and the climb winds steeply up to Chapman's Point.






The Green Point Lighthouse was the first to light Cape Town's shores. The iconic candy-striped structure stands proud on the Sea Point Promenade. It is about 200 years old, although back then it was quite different: the lamp ran on sperm whale oil. These days it holds powerful diotropic lights. The characteristic foghorn has been around since the early 20s, despite much complaining from residents at the time.

The Fish Hoek beach is stretched over a large area and so you will always find plenty of space to enjoy your surroundings. The bay at Fish Hoek beach offers great swimming facilities and the warm Indian Ocean makes the waters even more inviting. It is also a great beach if you're just starting to surf or would like to gain confidence in the water by body boarding.





Muizenberg is a beach-side suburb of Cape Town, South Africa. It is situated where the shore of the Cape Peninsula curves round to the east on the False Bay coast. It is considered to be the birthplace of surfing in South Africa and is currently home to a surfing community, centered on the popular 'Surfer's Corner

Local Cuisines

Cape Town is a veritable foodie haven. The city's history, combined with acceptance of global food trends means that there are several dishes you have to eat when visiting the city. Cape Town has a unique multi-cultural heritage that influences much of its cuisine. There are few dishes or foods that stand alone as "traditional." Rather, you'll find a mix of styles, flavors, and techniques—from Cape Dutch to French and Indian. And though not traditional, dishes like sushi are also top quality. Here is the food you should be eating in Cape Town.

Fish & Chips: Cape Town's proximity to flourishing oceans and history of British colonial rule has resulted in a vibrant fish and chips culture. This reveals itself in various forms—from casual street food style eateries and hole-in-the-wall hatches serving up deep-fried fish and chips through to high-end line fish served at top restaurants. Most fish served in Cape Town is fresh and worth exploring. If you want to keep it traditional, head to a specialist fish and chips shop, preferably by the ocean, and order a portion of deep-fried hake or snoek with chips. Kalky's in Kalk Bay and Snoekies in Hout Bay are two original shops to visit. It may not be the healthiest option, but it's tasty, cheap, and the perfect accompaniment to a day by the sea.



<u>Gatsby</u>: There are few foods as truly Capetonian as a gatsby. It originated in the Cape Flats and dates back to the mid-70s. Technically it's a large submarine-style sandwich that comes with various fillings. The reality is that it's crammed full of a variety of meats, chips, and sauces, costs only a few Rands, and is almost impossible to finish due to its size. The meat used in gatsbys is not usually the best grade, so you can expect it to be masala steak, polony, or highly processed vienna sausage. You won't find this meal on the menu of your typical high-end restaurant, but rather at hole-in-the-wall shops and no-frills eateries such as The Golden Dish, Cosy Corner, or Bona Fast Food.



Bunny Chow: Bunny Chow is a classic South African meal that draws on the country's Indian influence. It's a filling fast food dish that is essentially half a loaf of hollowed out bread filled with curry. The meat is usually beef or chicken, and aside from the unusual name has nothing to do with rabbit. Like the gatsby, few people manage an entire portion, so it might be safer starting out with a quarter loaf, or kota.



Biltong and Droëwors: Less a dish and more a snack, this is the staple bar or road trip food in many South African diets. Biltong and droëwors are made by drying meat and adding a special blend of spices. Biltong is simply cured and dried, and then sliced or left in solid sticks. Droëwors is essentially a dried sausage. Though on paper both sound slightly bizarre, most meat eaters consider them as addictive snacks.



<u>Traditional Desserts:</u> There are a handful of traditional sweet treats worth seeking out to round off your meal. Milk tart, malva pudding, and koeksisters will keep most people with a sweet tooth satisfied. Though these started out as traditional recipes made in local kitchens, you'll find them in various iterations in bakeries, supermarkets, and on many restaurant menus.



Indian Restaurants

Capetonians are absolutely crazy about spicy food, with so many different cultures in SA we get to experience different kinds of spicy right on our doorstep. Whether it's Chakalaka, peri-peri or a delicious masala steak, the options are there. With Indian cuisine seen as the "king and queen" of spicy food, finding Indian food in Cape Town is very easy.

Bukhara V & A Waterfront: Bukhara is generally accepted as one of the finest Indian restaurants in the Cape. With a distinctly North Indian influence, the food prepared in the Tandoor oven takes things to the next level. The restaurant can easily cater to a group of 100 to 150 people at a go.

Maharaja South Indian Restaurant: The Maharaja has been in existence for the past 40 years bringing to Cape Town a true Durban style curry. Located in the heart of Tamboerskloof, tucked away right below Table Mountain, this majestic Indian restaurant is a timeless classic that offers more than just an evening out.

Bombay Chilli (Muizenberg): With another branch in Plumstead, the curries at Bombay chilli are all exquisitely out of this world. Known more for its food than the decor, the Muizenberg branch's butter chicken has drawn in almost every curry loving Capetonians and tourist. Select a curry from their incredibly wide range, enjoy it, then stroll a few hundred metres for a walk on Muizenberg beachfront.

Visa Requirements

South Africa Visa Documentation (Visa Stamping)

- Passport, (valid for at least 30 days after the intended stay/departure date from South Africa; at least Two unused/blank visa pages)(Along with Old Passport i.e. Previous Passport is Mandatory- Applicable in Mumbai, Pune, Ahmedabad, Goa and Bangalore only).
- Fully completed visa application form-11 (DHA-84) must be completed in black ink and block letters.
- Application form-11 (DHA-84) must be signed by the applicant and signature should match the signature on the passport.
- Proof of funds (Last 03 month's bank statement signed and stamped by the bank with a balance of South
 African Currency R 3000 or equivalent in INR for Delhi and Mumbai) (Required original Indian bank statement
 on bank letterhead with stamp and signature and No passbook, No e-statements, No Net banking copies will be
 accepted.)
- Proof of hotel booking, (verifiable) stating the name, passport number of applicant(s) and duration of visit, physical address, as well as contact details of the hotel as well as authorized signature's name, designation and signature.

Visa Requirements

Visa Requirements

Souvenirs

Part of the fun of vacationing in Cape Town is shopping for souvenirs to remember your holiday for years to come, and spoiling your friends and family back home. You can find a great selection of authentic African curios, gifts and artwork on almost every corner.

<u>African wood carvings</u>: Wherever you go in Cape Town, you're bound to come across a variety of creative wood carvings like African masks, figurines and animals — they make great coffee table centerpieces or wall adornments! Depending on your budget, you can find quality designer pieces at boutiques like <u>Taung Trading Post</u>, or inexpensive carvings at one of the many craft markets and roadside stalls around the city.



<u>Tanzanite</u>: Due to the favorable exchange rate, many international tourists come to South Africa to shop for gemstones and precious metals. Aside from diamonds, tanzanite is a sought after stone with a limited supply from its only source in Africa — the foothills of <u>Mount Kilimanjaro</u>. It is a thousand times rarer than diamond and is deep blue in color, which makes for alluring jewelry. Remember to always buy tanzanite at an <u>authentic jewelry store</u>.



Rooibos Tea: Rooibos (redbush) tea is a quintessential South African product to add to your shopping list whilst in Cape Town. The fragrant, caffeine-free tea comes from a shrub that grows exclusively in the Cederberg mountains, three hours outside of Cape Town. Rooibos tea is exported worldwide and is popular for its antioxidant properties and ability to blend well with other herbal teas.



<u>Mebos</u>: Mebos is a popular South African preserve made from dried apricots. It is made by brining ripe apricots, shaping them into flat rounds, and leaving them out in the sun to dry for a few days. They can be coated in sugar or eaten as is, and make a delicious sweet-and-sour snack between meals.



Amarula: Amarula is a famous South African liqueur made from the exotic fruit of the Marula tree indigenous to the plains of sub-Saharan Africa. It is best enjoyed on the rocks or over ice cream. Many chefs also like to use the creamy liqueur in desserts at local fine dining restaurants.
