SCANDINAVIA (NORWAY, SWEDEN, FINLAND)



Overview of Scandinavian

- Scandinavia is a historical and geographical region centered on the Scandinavian peninsula of Northern Europe. Theoretically, Scandinavia is defined as the three kingdoms that historically shared the Scandinavian Peninsula. Culturally speaking, Iceland, Finland, and the Faroe Islands are nowadays usually included when referring to "Scandinavia" (Nordic Countries). Scandinavia has a total population of over 24 million.
- The weather in Scandinavia in most parts is generally mild and pleasant. Scandinavia's climate varies from north to south and from west to east. Depending on your destination, travel weather may vary from one Scandinavian capital to the next but oftentimes it can be said that the temperate Scandinavian weather is sunny and mild in summer and a little colder than usual in winter. More extreme temperatures are found beyond the Arctic Circle.
- The languages spoken in Scandinavia include Danish, Swedish, Norwegian, Icelandic and Faroese. These languages are generally sorted into East-Scandinavian (Danish, Swedish) and West-Scandinavian (Norwegian, Icelandic) languages. Finnish belongs to the Finno-Ugric language family.



Overview of Scandinavian

- Scandinavia puts on quite a show year-round, and it's free. The Scandinavian natural phenomena include the Northern Lights, the Midnight Sun, and the Polar Nights. The best show of these phenomena can be witnessed in the region of the Arctic circle, e.g. in Iceland and in the northern parts of Sweden, Norway, and Finland.
- Summer in Scandinavia, the months of July and August, is a great time to visit. At this time of year, you're more likely to have pleasant weather and nature comes alive with locals as well as travellers heading outside to experience the great outdoors.
- While summertime may be a great time to visit the Nordic countries, it is not the best time to see the northern lights. This is especially true of the northern regions, like Northern Norway, as well as Finish and Swedish Lapland, where the sun doesn't fully set during the summer months. Visiting between October and March, also known as aurora borealis season, gives you the best chance of seeing this spectacular light show.



Overview of Norway

- Norway is a country in Northern Europe occupying the western portion of the Scandinavian Peninsula. The capital city of Norway is Oslo. Norwegian is the official language of Norway.
- In 1949, Norway became a member of North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO). The discovery of oil and gas in adjacent waters in the late 1960s boosted Norway's economic fortunes. In referenda held in 1972 and 1994, Norway rejected joining the European Union (EU). However, Norway is a member of the European Economic Area (EEA).
- English is widely spoken in Norway, and virtually every Norwegian can speak fluent (or understand a minimum of, this is mostly the elder people) English. Tourist information is usually printed in several **languages**. ... Many Norwegians also **speak** or understand a second foreign **language**, often German, French or Spanish.
- Best time to visit:- **Between May & June and September & October**
- Norwegian krone (NOK) is the currency.



Overview of Oslo

- Oslo, formerly (1624–1877) Christiania or (1877–1925) Kristiania, capital and largest city of Norway. It lies at the head of Oslo Fjord in the south eastern part of the country.
- The city was renamed Oslo in 1925 and developed rapidly after World War II. In 1948 Oslo incorporated the nearby township of Aker, and in the following decades a number of satellite towns and residential areas grew up to the east and west of the city. On July 22, 2011, the city centre was the target of a massive bomb attack that damaged government buildings, including the Prime minister's office.
- Oslo has exceptional natural advantages for winter sports, especially cross-country skiing. The city's annual Holmenkollen ski-jump competitions bring together participants from all the leading ski nations, and the site also houses an interesting ski museum.



Overview of Oslo

- Oslo is the centre of Norwegian trade, banking, industry, and shipping. Oslo Harbour is the largest, as well as the busiest, in the country. The leading industries are the production of consumer goods and the electro technical and graphic industries. The important Norwegian fur auctions are held at Økern, to the northeast. Oslo is also the junction of road, rail, and airway networks of the country.
- The leading Norwegian cultural institutions are to be found in Oslo. The city centre contains the National Theatre, the Norwegian Theatre, the Oslo New Theatre, the Oslo Concert Hall, and the Norwegian Opera. Near the oldest part of the University of Oslo are found the Historical Museum (with the Ethnographic Museum) and the National Museum of Art, Architecture, and Design, the latter of which contains an excellent collection of paintings, especially works by Edvard Munch.



Overview of Bergen

- Bergen, Norway's second largest city, is a great place to experience rich cultural and historical attractions, as well as seeing majestic natural wonders. Nicknamed the 'Gateway to the Fjords', you'll find yourself at the doorstep of Norway's' longest fjord, Sognefjord, and the beautiful Hardangerfjord. You can also spend hours walking around the streets of this vibrant city, exploring museums and its old town, the UNESCO World Heritage site Bryggen.
- Because of its proximity to the Norwegian Sea and its mountainous landscape, Bergen is notoriously rainy throughout much of the year. Winters, although cold, are warmer than any other Norwegian city. We suggest visiting during the summer, when the temperatures are slightly warmer - but pack a sweater!
- Fresh seafood is the core of Bergen cuisine. Among local specialities, you'll find Bergen fish soup, fish cakes and "persetorsk", a traditional Bergen steamed cod dish.
- Bergen is also often called "the city between the seven mountains". By far the most easily accessible summit is Fløyen, 320 metres above sea level. It is connected to the city centre by Fløibanen funicular by a six-minute ride.



Overview of Bergen

- The highest of the seven mountains is Ulriken, 643 metres above sea level. You can easily reach this top as well, thanks to the Ulriken cable car. Standing on the top of Ulriken, overlooking the sea, islands, mountains and fjords, you might understand why Bergen often is referred to as “the fjord capital”.
- Perfectly situated between the two biggest fjords in Norway, the Hardangerfjord and the Sognefjord, the city is an ideal starting point for fjord excursions.
- The heart of the fjords. The city between the seven mountains.



Overview of Finland

- Finland – sovereign Nordic country located in Northern Europe. Finland has borders with Sweden to the west, Russia to the east, and Norway to the north, while Estonia lies to its south across the Gulf of Finland. The capital city is Helsinki.
- Finland, a country of forests and lakes, is perhaps best known for its unspoilt natural beauty. In the far north, the White Nights, during which the sun does not set, last for around 10 weeks of the summer. In winter the same area goes through nearly eight weeks when the sun never rises above the horizon.
- Finnish cuisine has been influenced by continental, Russian and Swedish food. Traditional specialities include fish (especially salmon and turbot roe), as well as reindeer meat. Dishes to look out for include *karjalanpiirakka* (rice or potato pastry) and *kalakukko* (fish and pork fat baked inside a loaf).
- For plenty of snow and winter activities, December to March is the best time. For springtime sun and the revival of nature after the winter, April to May is the period. For long and warm summer days and plenty of events, opt for June, July and August. For autumn leaf colour, visit in September-October.



Overview of Finland

- Though the official language in Finnish , if you speak English, you should not have any difficulties as most Finns speak fluent (or at least understandable) English.
- One of the great concepts in Finland is called “**Everyman’s Rights**”. This gives you the right to roam freely in natural areas like forests, fells, lakes and rivers, without permission from landowners. The concept has evolved over time and started as an unwritten code created by a sparse population living in a vast, densely forested country.
- Some guidelines: you can pick wild berries and mushrooms, but not someone’s apples or plums. You can go canoeing and camping, but not too close to someone’s house. In many areas, fishing requires a permit.



Overview of Helsinki

- Helsinki, the largest city in Finland, is the nation's capital and its administrative, economic, scientific and cultural centre. The metropolitan area covers 0.2 percent of Finland's land area, yet 19 percent of the country's population lives there, generating 30 percent of the nation's total output.
- Helsinki is the engine of Finland's growth and is the country's main economic and logistical centre. Its industrial structure is diversified, but services and high-tech industries account for a large proportion of output.
- The central parts of Helsinki are located on a peninsula, and the city has a strong maritime flavour. Whole suburbs are located on islands, and the coastal areas of Helsinki are enriched by an archipelago of 300 islands. Helsinki is also a green city, with one-third of the land area preserved for parks and other green areas. The World Economic Forum places Finland fourth in the world in environmental performance (2008).
- The best times to visit Helsinki are May, early June and September – though you'll find plenty going on throughout the year.



Overview of Helsinki

- Helsinki's main attractions, includes Sibelius Monument, Esplanade Park, Old Market Hall, Market square, Uspenski Orthodox Cathedral, Senate Square, Temppeliaukio/Rock Church, Havis Amanda and Helsinki Cathedral etc. along with photo stops.
- The city of Helsinki is Finland's hub for both national and international cuisine. These are some of the best locally sourced staples of Southern Finland and dishes that are popular throughout the entire country. Fish and meat (usually pork, beef or reindeer) play a prominent role in **traditional Finnish dishes** , while the **dishes** elsewhere have traditionally included various vegetables and mushrooms.



Overview of Rovaniemi

- Rovaniemi is a city and municipality of Finland. There are many reasons to love Rovaniemi – spellbinding nature and phenomena, Lappish traditions and culture, urban life and wild activities make the Official Hometown of Santa Claus a unique place to visit.
- Santa Claus’ original home lies in the mysterious Korvatunturi (“Ear Fell”) in Finnish Lapland. Since the exact location is a secret only known to a chosen few, he decided to establish an office in Rovaniemi, the capital of Lapland, in 1985. Rovaniemi received the status of the Official Hometown of Santa Claus in 2010.
- Also known as Aurora Borealis, the Northern Lights are visible on around 150 nights a year in Finnish Lapland. In Rovaniemi, the spellbinding astral show can be witnessed in and around the city from mid-August until early April.
- In scientific terms, the Northern Lights are caused by electrically charged particles from the sun colliding with each other upon entering the earth’s atmosphere, which results in emissions of various colours of light. Green is by far the most common, but red, pink, violet, yellow and even blue can be seen at times.



Overview of Rovaniemi

- Lappish cuisine is simple and rugged, just like the landscapes it stems from. Fresh seasonal ingredients play a key role in preparation, and bringing out their original flavours is held in high regard. In Rovaniemi, Lappish food tastes equally delicious in a fine dining setting as well as by a campfire in the wilderness.
- The iconic fish dish of Lapland is salmon soup, available in several restaurants in Rovaniemi.
- Cold winters, warm summers, colourful autumns and light-filled springs that bring about the rebirth of nature are the foremost nominators in the northern annual cycle. In Rovaniemi, the four main seasons are completed by seasons of transition in between them, which means the weather is ever-changing
- In scientific terms, the Northern Lights are caused by electrically charged particles from the sun colliding with each other upon entering the earth's atmosphere, which results in emissions of various colours of light. Green is by far the most common, but red, pink, violet, yellow and even blue can be seen at times.



Overview of Kemi

- Kemi is a town and municipality of Finland. It is located very near the city of Tornio and the Swedish border. Kemi is situated on the Bothnian Bay, at the mouth of the river Kemijoki, and it is part of the Lapland region.
- Kemi has a claim to fame as the home of the world's largest snow castle (reconstructed every year to a different design). The Snow Castle of Kemi is usually built in the inner harbour of the city. A model of The Crown of Finland is kept in the town's gemstone gallery. It also houses replicas of the Imperial State Crown of Great Britain, the sceptre of the Czar of Russia, the Orbs of Denmark, and the diamond necklace of Marie Antoinette, among other items.
- Kemi Snow Castle is located right by the sea near the city centre. Open from the end of January until beginning of April. The world's largest Snow Restaurant is here. Snow Chapel is a memorable venue for wedding ceremonies. Snow Hotel with unique snow rooms.



Overview of Haparanda

- Haparanda is the easternmost city in Sweden. It is situated on the country border towards the charming Finnish town of Tornea. This is the perfect spot to experience northern lights in winter, or see the midnight sun in high summer.
- Haparanda is just as exciting to explore during the summer. Visitors can go fishing in Torne River, the largest river in Norrbotten, known for its abundance of whitefish and salmon. The Haparanda Archipelago is Sweden's northernmost archipelago consisting of 600 islands and islets. These include real national park gems with seals and a diverse bird life.
- Average temperatures in Haparanda vary drastically. Considering humidity, temperatures feel cold for most of the year with a fair chance of precipitation about half of the year. The hottest months are July, August, and then June. The warmest time of year is generally late July.



Overview of Lulea

- Lulea is a city on the coast of northern Sweden, and the capital of Norrbotten County, the northernmost county in Sweden.
- The world's first indoor mall was opened in Luleå in 1955 (architect: Ralph Erskine) and was named *Shopping*. There are two other malls in Luleå: Strand and Smedjan. The main shopping streets in Luleå are Storgatan and Kungsgatan. A few kilometres outside Luleå there is a shopping centre called Storheden.
- Luleå has a variety of cultural institutions, among them Norrbottensteatern; Norrbotten Museum; and Norrbotten Big Band led by Tim Hagans. In January 2007 the Cultural House (Kulturens Hus) was opened. A library, concerts, and art exhibitions are all hosted here.
- Luleå has a subarctic climate, which borders on a continental climate with short, mild to warm summers and long, cold, snowy winters. Summers are very bright, with marginal twilight being the only exception during the summer solstice.



Overview of Narvik

- Narvik is the third-largest municipality in Nordland county, Norway by population. The administrative centre of the municipality is the town of Narvik.
- With islands to the west and mountains in every other direction, Narvik offers sporting and sightseeing activities in scenic surroundings. Go fishing in the Ofotfjord, enjoy skiing or hiking in the mountains, or visit the Narvik War Museum.
- Experience the Northern and Arctic Lights in unique urban frames, from the top of Narvikfjellet. Savour the serenity and the view of high mountains, deep fjords and a vibrant town.

Places to Visit

The Vigeland Park (Frogner Park)

- Sculpture park & museum displaying the works of Gustav Vigeland, plus temporary art exhibitions.
- Although sometimes incorrectly referred to in English as the "Vigeland (Sculpture) Park," the Vigeland installation is not a separate park, but the name of the sculptures within Frogner Park.
- Frogner Park (Norwegian: *Frognerparken*) is a public park located in the borough of Frogner in Oslo, Norway, and is historically part of Frogner Manor.
- The sculpture park consists of sculptures as well as larger structures such as bridges and fountains.



Places to Visit

Viking Ship Museum

- The Viking Ship Museum is located on the Bygdøy peninsula in Oslo, Norway.
- It is part of the Museum of Cultural History of the University of Oslo, and houses three Viking era burial ships that were found as part of archaeological finds from Tune, Gokstad, Oseberg and the Borre mound cemetery.
- The museum is most famous for the completely whole Oseberg ship, excavated from the largest known ship burial in the world. Other main attractions at the Viking Ship Museum are the Gokstad ship and Tune ship.
- All the Viking ships at our museum were ocean going vessels before they were hauled onto land to be used in burial rituals for their wealthy owners. In the burial mounds, archaeologists unearthed skeletons, beautiful wood carvings and a diverse range of artifacts from the fascinating world of the Vikings.



Places to Visit

Flam (Village in Norway)

- Flam is a village in southwestern Norway, in an area known for its fjords.
- It sits at the end of Aurlandsfjord, a branch of the vast Sognefjord.
- The dramatic Stegastein viewing platform juts out high above the Aurlandsfjord. South of Flam Harbour, the 17th-century wooden Flam Church lies in the valley.
- The Flam Railway offers valley and waterfall views as it climbs to a station on the Hardangervidda plateau.

Lillehammer Excursion

- Lillehammer is a ski resort town in southern Norway. Its Maihaugen open-air museum displays buildings from the 1200s to the present.
- The nearby Norwegian Olympic Museum has exhibits chronicling Lillehammer's 1994 Winter Olympics and features a biathlon simulator.
- Lysgårdsbakkene Ski Jumping Arena includes a chairlift with views over the park. North is the Lillehammer Olympic Bobsleigh and Luge Track.
- The rock carvings at Drotten, Fåberg, west of Gudbrandsdalslågen about 1.5 km (0.9 mi) above Brunlaug bridge.



Places to Visit

Santa Claus Village

- Santa Claus Village is an amusement park in Rovaniemi in the Lapland region of Finland. It was opened in 1985.
- Santa Claus Village is located about 8 kilometres (5 mi) northeast of Rovaniemi and about 2 kilometres (1.2 mi) from the Rovaniemi Airport. The first original home of Santa Claus was Korvatunturi. In 1985, Rovaniemi was declared as an official hometown of Santa Claus.
- The Arctic Circle cuts right through Santa Claus Village. A white line denoting the Arctic Circle (at its position in 1865) is painted across the park. Visitors officially enter the Arctic area when they cross the line. The line is a very popular photo spot for visitors.



Places to Visit

Snow Castle in Kemi

- The Snow Castle of Kemi is the biggest snow fort in the world. It is rebuilt every winter with a different architecture in Kemi, Finland. In 1996 the first snow castle drew 300,000 visitors.
- The Snow Castle of Kemi also hosts such things as an adventure land for children, a theatre and ice art exhibitions with lights and sound effects. Many opera singers and dancers have performed in the Snow Castle of Kemi.
- There's a year-round refrigerated restaurant/bar carved from ice, plus a conventional restaurant and a cafe.
- Despite its varying configurations, the snow castle has a few recurring elements: a chapel, a restaurant and a hotel.
- The Snow Restaurant has ice tables and seats covered with reindeer fur, as well as ice sculptures.
