# Overview



Bahrain is an island country in the Persian Gulf. The sovereign state comprises a small archipelago centred around Bahrain Island, situated between the Qatar peninsula and the north eastern coast of Saudi Arabia.

Deserts are usually perceived as barren and uneventful places, where the passing of time is only visible through the ever-shifting sands. This is not the case, however, with the desert of Bahrain

The best time to visit Bahrain goes from **mid-November to mid-March** in order to avoid the summer heat. Between December and February, the weather is generally mild and pleasant, but you must put into account some cool days, especially in January and February, a bit of cold at night, and even some rain. Months of Ramadan is not a preferred time to visit this island country as there are various restriction in place. National language is Arabic. The largest community in the Kingdom is of Indians.

# Places to visit

# Al Fateh Grand Mosque

- The Al-Fateh Islamic Centre & Al Fateh Grand Mosque is one of the largest mosques in the world, encompassing 6,500 square meters and having the capacity to accommodate over 7,000 worshippers at a time. The mosque was built by the late Sheikh Isa ibn Salman Al Khalifa in 1987 and was named after Ahmed Al Fateh.
- The mosque is the largest place of worship in Bahrain. The huge dome built on top of the Al-Fateh Mosque is constructed entirely of fibreglass. Weighing over 60 Megagrams (tonne), the dome is currently the world's largest fibreglass dome. The marble used in the floors is Italian and the chandelier is from Austria. The doors are made of teak wood from India. Throughout the mosque are calligraphy writings in a very old type of style called Bahrain.
- Besides being a place of worship, the mosque is one of the premier tourist attractions in Bahrain. It is open from 9am to 4pm and tours are conducted in a variety of languages including English, French, Filipino, Russian and many other languages, special arrangements are encouraged for smooth sailing. The mosque is closed to visitors and tourists on all Fridays.



# Arad Fort

- Arad Fort is a 15th-century fort in Bahrain. Formerly guarding a separate island of its own, the fort and its surroundings have since been joined to Muharraq Island
- Arad Fort was built in the typical style of Islamic forts during the 15th century before the Portuguese invasion of Bahrain in AD 1622. This fort has a beautiful history. A few feuds between the Islamic divisions of Bahrain have taken place here. This fort is one of the compact defensive forts in Bahrain.



# Beit Al Quran

- Beit Al Quran is a multi-purpose complex dedicated to the Islamic arts and is located in Manama. Established in 1990, the complex is most famous for its Islamic museum, which has been acknowledged as being one of the most renowned Islamic museums in the world.
- Beit al Quran (House of Quran) is a multi-purpose complex dedicated to the Islamic arts. Founded in 1990, the complex houses one of the most renowned Islamic museums in the world that consists of ten exhibition halls. The building is engraved with Arabic script, and the museum showcases a fascinating collection of Quranic Manuscripts dating back to the 7<sup>th</sup> century as well as Qurans written on parchment, grains, peas, and rice are among the impressive objects in the collection. The building also houses a mosque, a library, an auditorium, a madrasa (religious school), and hosts a variety of art exhibitions.
- Admission for tourists is free.

# Manana Souq

- Manama Souq is a warren of narrow streets and alleyways emanating south from Bab Al Bahrain. Here you can pick up everything from electronic goods and bargain t-shirts to spices and shisha pipes. But the real reason to visit is to wander through the bustling streets of a market that still evokes the atmosphere of an ancient souq.



# Bahrain International Circuit

- Located in the heart of the Sakhir desert, Bahrain International Circuit is a unique and contemporary facility that is synonymous with the highest levels of global motorsport. Featuring five different track layouts, the circuit first saw life in 2004 when the first ever Formula 1 Grand Prix took place in the country, making it the first-ever track in the Middle East to host the Formula 1 World Championship. Bahrain International Circuit continues to host staggering crowds and a wide range of events and activities, and serves as a platform that encourages motorsports in the country.
- Each year, the circuit gears up for the Formula One and transforms itself into a platform for motorsport enthusiasts and avid fans alike to witness an epic display of mastery on the track. As the drivers face each other in a thrilling battle that puts to test their agility and ability, racegoers hold their breath as the race starts and let out jubilant cheers as the champion makes his way to the chequered flag
- BIC also offers its fans exciting activities to experience F1 from the drivers seat and also houses a FIA certified Go-Karting track.



# Tree of Life

- The Tree of Life in Bahrain is a 9.75 meters high *Prosopis cineraria* tree that is over 400 years old. It is on a hill in a barren area of the Arabian Desert, 2 kilometres from Jebel Dukkha, the highest point in Bahrain, and 40 kilometres from Manama, the nearest city.
- It is not certain how the tree survives. Bahrain has little to no rain throughout the year. Its roots are 50 meters deep, which may be enough to reach the water source. Others say the tree has learned to extract moisture from grains of sand. Some assert that the tree is protected by Enki, a god of water in Babylonian and Sumerian religion Others claim that the tree is standing in what was once the Garden of Eden, and so has a more mystical source of water.



# Royal Camel Farm

- A visit to the Royal Camel Farm. Providing tourists with an unique insight into a treasured element of Bahraini culture, the farm is home to over 600 camels of all ages and sizes. The farm was created by the King of Bahrain, Sheik Mohammad as a means of preserving camels in Bahrain.
- Before the introduction of cars to the country camels were the primary means of transport for the people of Bahrain, as they are ideal to travel distances in the humid and dry climate. However, their numbers dwindled as other methods of transport became more practical, hence why the Sheik decide to create the Royal Camel Farm to protect the native species of the Arabian Peninsula.
- Located in Manama, just off the Janabiyah highway, The Royal Camel Farm is open every day from 8am to 5pm and is free to enter. There is no reception area however there are keepers available to show you around the park.



# Bahrain National Theater

- After the Cairo and Muscat Opera, this is the third largest theatre in the Middle East
- Yet another impressive work of architecture, this beautiful structure is adjacent to the National Museum. What is interesting about this theatre is its design that owes its inception to local tradition - right from the interwoven aluminium strips in the roof emulating traditional homes
- The curvaceous interior of the auditorium is representational of the sea going dhows to the number of seats, 1001, a tribute to The Thousand and One Nights.
- A visit to attend a show, which varies from classical music to ballet or even contemporary is or just to admire the architecture, is quite worth
- The venue can be exclusively booked for MICE groups for large scale events, Conference and exhibitions.



# Qalat Al Bahrain

- Known as Dilmun in ancient times, Bahrain's rich trading history is reflected in numerous archaeological digs around the island. Qalat al-Bahrain site (Bahrain Fort site) is among the most exciting of them and is registered as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- The fort is located atop a 17.5 hectare artificial hill that has been built while enduring over 4,000 years of continuous occupation. It is also the site of the former capital of Dilmun and is one of the most prolific archaeological digs in the Arabian Gulf. Excavations over the past 50 years have revealed residential, public, commercial, and military structures that testify to the importance of that location over the centuries.
- Additionally, a seaside café offers a stunning view of the fort and the surrounding palm groves.



# Al Ali Pottery

- A'ali pottery, located deep in the heart of Bahrain and amidst 4,000 year old burial mounds, is Bahrain's biggest pottery handicraft center. Visit their workshop and see the potters in action, using the old-fashioned foot operated wheel, and baking the finished pots in kilns built into the nearby burial mounds;
- a traditional method passed down through generations. They create beautiful pots and handicrafts of virtually every size and style imaginable, from naturally finished to brightly coloured pieces.
- A'AliPottery is great way to learn about one of Bahrain's most treasured traditions whilst getting some retail therapy too.



# King Fahad Causeway

The 25km-long King Fahd causeway links the Kingdom of Bahrain with the Eastern region of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. Crossing the Gulf of Bahrain, in the Persian Gulf, the causeway starts in Saudi Arabia at Al-Aziziyah, south of Alkhobar, and extends up to Al-Jasra, west of Manama in Bahrain. It comprises two segments, a longer bridge from Khobar to Nasan Island in Bahrain and a shorter stretch from Nasan Island to the main island of Bahrain.

- The world's largest underwater theme park will cover an area of 100,000 square meters. The dive site has a 70-meter long decommissioned Boeing 747 as its centre piece. The largest aircraft ever to be submerged.


